

Letter Instructions for Parent/Guardian

Letters from a Tooth Fairy present your child with a wonderful opportunity to embark on an adventure in imagination. And you can go along for the ride! So enter into the fun. Let your delight, surprise, perplexity, and involvement mirror that of your child as you share in the interaction with our engaging tooth fairies.

In terms of logistics for Skeeterflip's "Loose Tooth Verification Packet," please do the following:

Night 1

- 1. Hide Skeeterflip's first letter (pgs. 2 3) some place where you and your child can mutually "discover" it.
- 2. Hide the "Loose Tooth Verification Form" (pg. 4) in your child's shoe.

Next Day

- 1. Read the letter together, with all the drama you can muster!
- 2. Have your child fill out the "Loose Tooth Verification Form" and place it in his/her shoe.
- 3. Have your child put a sticker on his/her big toe before bedtime.

Night 2

1. When your child is asleep, quietly collect the form and store it away as a treasured keepsake.

For the next loose tooth

1. Hide Skeeterflip's second letter (pgs. 5 - 6) some place where you and your child can find it, along with a few extra copies of the "Loose Tooth Verification Form" (pg. 4).

For any loose teeth after that

1. Have your child fill out a copy of the "Loose Tooth Verification Form" for every new loose tooth.

When the tooth falls out

Hello.

Are you the child with a tooth that's getting loose? If so, I'm very glad I found you. I am Inspector Skeeterflip, and I'm the Loose Tooth Checker for the tooth fairies at The Tooth Fairy Company. My job is to find all the children who have a loose tooth so I can put their names on a special list. The tooth fairies like knowing which children will soon have a footh to give them.

I came tonight because I heard that your tooth is getting really wiggly. If that is in fact the case, put a sticker on your big toe when you go to bed tonight. (But please wash your foot first. One child I visited forgot to wash his foot and I passed out from the stinky smell.)



After you fall asleep, I'll come to your house and look at your feet. If your big toe has a sticker on it, I'll add your name to the Loose Tooth List and tell the tooth fairies that your tooth is going to come out very soon. Once it falls out, one of them will visit and bring you some ToothLoot (that's the money you get when a tooth fairy collects your tooth).

In addition, would you please fill out the Loose Tooth Verification

Form I am leaving in your shoe? Completing this paperwork now will

give us a head start on processing your ToothLoot benefits.

I hear you might have another loose tooth. This is wonderful news. The rest of the tooth fairy team will be so excited to hear this. (And poor Smigglesfert will probably have a sneezing fit. You know how he gets when he's over excited.)

Before I officially put your name on the Loose Tooth List, I need you to confirm this by putting a sticker on your big toe when you go to bed tonight.

And don't forget to fill out the Looge Tooth Verification

Form too. It's very important that we have a picture of your

face showing the looge tooth. (Color it green. The tooth, not

your face.) The tooth fairies need this picture so they can find



and identify you after your loose tooth falls out. They also check it to make sure they have the right child and the right tooth. (Remind me some time to tell you what happened when a tooth fairy forgot to do this.)

I'll come by tonight to check your toe and collect the form. If everything is in order, I'll add your name to the Loose Tooth List and we'll get your ToothLoot all ready for delivery.
